Optional ACT/SAT Deadline

- Most applicants will not be required to submit a standardized test score to be considered for admission to BYU for Spring, Summer, Fall 2021 and Winter 2022. See testoptional.byu.edu for more information.
- If students wish to apply with a standardized test score, BYU must have an official score by the published deadlines (see above).
- BYU does not accept super-scores. We use the highest composite score.

Transcripts

- Students who do not have a Utah SSID will self-report their classes and grades exactly as they appear on an official transcript from the high school.
- Utah students should be able to enter their SSID number into the app to import their high school transcript.
- Once admitted, students will need to submit an official high school transcript.
- If students have received any college credit for coursework, they must report it on the application and may need to submit an official transcript from the issuing college.
- Applicants with international/non-U.S. accredited work will require a credential evaluation from one of BYU's approved credential evaluators. Details at inteval.byu.edu.



Parts of the BYU Application

- Four essay questions (with prompts)
- Two activity responses (no activities list)
- Ecclesiastical Endorsement – Local bishop and member of the stake presidency
- Three Recommendations:
 - One from current seminary teacher (if applicable)
 - One from Junior or Senior year core (English, math science) teacher
 - One “other” (anyone else, not related)
- \$35 application fee
- **NEW!** – Fee waiver option: feewaiver.byu.edu

Scholarships

- All applicants: FAFSA and BYU Scholarship Application – scholarships.byu.edu (one application for all general scholarships, see website for details)
- **NEW!** – Cougar Pell Promise – cougarpellpromise.byu.edu (up to full LDS tuition for 4 years, see website for details)
- Free, vetted, third-party scholarship service byu.scholarshipuniverse.com
- Approximately 40% of incoming freshmen will receive some sort of financial aid
- There is no published matrix for academic awards

Housing

- On-campus housing is offered to admitted students based on when they submitted their admission application. The earlier they submit, the more likely it is they will be able to live where they want.
